Safety Precautions



Read Before Using

Incorrect usage may cause serious damage or injury.

The seriousness of potential damage or injuries is classified as either a **WARNING** or **CAUTION**.



WARNING

This symbol indicates that ignoring instructions may cause death or serious injury.



CAUTION

This symbol indicates that ignoring instructions may cause moderate injury to your person, damage to your unit, or other property.



This symbol indicates that you should **NEVER** perform the indicated action.



WARNING

- ⊘ **DO NOT** modify the length of the power supply cord or use an extension cord to power the unit.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** share the electrical circuit with other appliances. Improper or insufficient power supply can cause fire or electrical shock.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** expose your body directly to the cool air for prolonged periods of time.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** insert fingers or foreign objects into air inlet / outlet vents.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** attempt to repair, relocate, or modify the unit yourself. Always contact your qualified service professional if any of this is required.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** allow combustible materials within 3 feet (1 meter) of unit; or store combustible gas / vapor emitting materials (e.g. gas cans, rags used with solvents) within the same enclosed area as operating unit.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** allow children to play with the air conditioner. Children should be supervised around the unit at all times.
1. Installation must be performed by an authorized technician according to installation instructions. Improper installation may cause water leakage, electrical shock, or fire.
 2. In North America, installation must be performed in accordance with the requirement of NEC and CEC (by authorized personnel only.) Contact an authorized service technician for repair or maintenance of the unit.
 3. This appliance is not intended for use by children under the age of 8, or persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, unless they are supervised or have been given instruction concerning safe usage and understand the hazards involved by a person responsible for their safety.
 4. In the event of any abnormalities, such as the smell of burning, immediately turn off power to the unit and contact an authorized service technician.

Safety Precautions


CAUTION

- ⊘ **DO NOT** touch switches with a wet hand. It may cause electric shock.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** use the device for any other purpose than the intended use.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** expose plants or animals directly to the airflow.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** place food, precision instruments, plants, animals, paint, etc. on the unit.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** clean the interior unit with water.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** use combustible cleaning agents as this could cause fire or deformation.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** place burning objects near the unit or directly in the path of its airflow.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** step on or place objects on exterior unit.
 - ⊘ **DO NOT** allow unit to run for extended periods with doors and/or windows open or in extreme humidity.
1. If the unit is to be used in conjunction with other heaters, the air should be refreshed periodically, otherwise there is a risk of reduced oxygen.
 2. Switch unit off during storms to avoid electrical damage.
 3. On the interior unit, check that the drainage line is correctly connected to avoid leakage.
 4. On the exterior unit, check that condensation water can run off unhindered to avoid damage.
 5. The unit must be earthed (grounded) in accordance with local codes.
 6. For electrical safety, we recommend that you install an earth leakage circuit-breaker.
 7. If the power cable is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.


Note about Flourinated Gasses:

1. This air-conditioning unit contains flourinated gases.
2. For specific information on the type of gas and the amount, please refer to the relevant label on the unit itself.
3. Installation, service, maintenance and repair of this unit must be performed by a certified technician.
4. Product recycling must be performed by a certified technician.
5. If the system has a leak-detection system installed, it should be checked for leaks at least every 12 months.
6. Keep a record of all leak checks for the lifetime of the unit.

The air conditioner consists of the indoor unit, the outdoor unit, the connecting pipe and the remote control.



- For inverter type, this switch is used for after-sales service purpose only, the user should not push it.
- For fixed-frequency type, this function is used to operate the unit temporarily in case you misplace the remote control or its batteries are exhausted. Two modes including **FORCED AUTO** and **FORCED COOL** can be selected through the **TEMPORARY BUTTON** on the air-in grill control box of the indoor unit. Once you push this button, the air conditioner will run in such order: **FORCED AUTO, FORCED COOL, OFF, and back to FORCED AUTO.**



FORCED AUTO

The **OPERATION** lamp is lit, and the air conditioner will run under **FORCED AUTO** mode. The remote control operation is enabled to operate according to the received signal. (See the Remote Control Manual packaged with the unit for details.)

FORCED COOL

The **OPERATION** lamp flashes, the air conditioner will turn to **FORCED AUTO** after it is enforced to cool with a wind speed of **HIGH** for 30 minutes. The remote control operation is disabled.

OFF

The **OPERATION** lamp goes off. The air conditioner is **OFF** while the remote control operation is enabled.

NOTE

All the pictures in this manual are for explanation purposes only. They may be slightly different from the unit you purchased (depending on model). The actual shape may vary.

Operate the unit within the temperature ranges listed in the table below for safe and efficient operation.

MODE	OUTDOOR TEMPERATURE	ROOM TEMPERATURE
Cooling Operation	32 °F~122°F / 0°C ~ 50°C	62°F ~90°F (17°C~32°C)
	5 °F~122°F / -15°C ~ 50°C (for the models with low temperature cooling system)	
Heating Operation (cooling only type without)	5°F~76°F / -15°C ~ 24°C	32°F~86°F (0°C~30°C)
Dry Operation	32 °F~122°F / 0°C ~ 50°C	62°F ~90°F (17°C~32°C)

NOTE

- If air conditioner is used outside the above conditions, it may cause the unit to function abnormally.
- The air conditioner may produce condensation when the humidity is elevated in the room. To reduce this issue, keep the door and windows closed.

Three-Minute Protection Feature

A protection feature prevents the air conditioner from being activated for approximately 3 minutes when it restarts immediately after operation.

Power Failure

Power failure during operation will stop the unit completely.

- The **OPERATION** lamp on the indoor unit will start flashing when power is restored.
- To restart operation, push the **ON/OFF** button on the remote controller.
- Lightning or a car wireless telephone operating nearby may cause the unit to malfunction.

Disconnect the unit with the power and then connect the unit with the power again. Push the **ON/OFF** button on the remote control to restart operation.

Refrigerant Leakage Detection

With this new technology, the display area will appear "**EC**" and the **LED** indication lamps continue flashing when the outdoor unit detects refrigerant leakage.

HINTS FOR ECONOMICAL OPERATION

The following should be noticed to ensure an economical operation. (Refer to corresponding chapter for details)

- Adjust the air flow direction properly to avoid winding toward your body.
- Adjust the room temperature properly to get a comfortable situation and to avoid supercooling and superheating.
- In cooling, close the curtains to avoid direct sunlight.
- To keep cool or warm air in the room, never open doors or windows more often than necessary.
- Set the timer for the desired operating time.
- Never put obstructions near the air outlet or the air inlet; it will cause lower efficiency, even a sudden stop.
- If you don't plan to use the unit for a long time, please disconnect power and remove the batteries from the remote control. When the power switch is connected, some energy will be consumed, even if the air conditioner isn't in operation. So please disconnect the power to save energy. And please switch the power on 12 hours before you restart the unit to ensure a smooth operation.
- A clogged air filter will reduce cooling or heating efficiency, please clean it once two weeks.

CAUTION

- Before you clean the air conditioner, be sure the power supply is off.
- Check if the wiring is not broken off or disconnected.
- Use a dry cloth to wipe the indoor unit and remote control.
- A wet cloth may be used to clean the indoor unit if it is very dirty.
- Never use a damp cloth on the remote control.
- Do not use a chemically-treated duster for wiping or leave such material on the unit for long. It could damage or fade the surface of the unit.
- Do not use benzine, thinner, polishing powder, or similar solvents for cleaning. These may cause the plastic surface to crack or deform.

Maintenance After A Long Stop Period

(eg. at the beginning of the season)

- Check and remove anything that might be blocking inlet and outlet vents of indoor units and outdoor units.
- Clean air filters and casings of indoor units. Refer to "Cleaning the air filter" for details on how to proceed and make sure to install clean air filters back in the same position.
- Turn on the power at least 12 hours before operating the unit in order to ensure smoother operation. As soon as the power is turned on, the remote control displays appear.

Maintenance Before A Long Stop Period

(eg. at the end of the season)

- Let the indoor units run in fan only operation for about half a day in order to dry the interior of the units.
- Clean air filters and casings of indoor units. Refer to "Cleaning the air filter" for details on how to proceed and make sure to install clean air filters back in the same position.

Cleaning The Air Filter

(on some models)

- The air filter can prevent dust or other particulate from going inside the unit. When the filter gets dirty, the air conditioner efficiency decreases.
- Therefore, the filter must be cleaned once every two weeks during long time usage.
- If the air conditioner is installed in a dusty place, increase the frequency of air filter cleaning.
- If the accumulated dust is too heavy to be cleaned, please replace the filter with a new one (replaceable air filter is optional).
- The filter cleaning should be performed by a suitable service provider.

If your Air Handler is a rear ventilated unit, please remove the filter fixed screws (2) and take down the filter away from the unit.



If your Air Handler is a descensional ventilated unit, please push the filter up slightly to let the position retainer escape away from the flange fixed holes, and take off the filter according to the arrow direction shows in the following fig.




Clean the air filter (a vacuum cleaner or pure water may be used to clean the air filter. If the dust accumulation is too heavy, use a soft brush and mild detergent to clean it and dry out in cool place) .



CAUTION

Do not dry out the air filter under direct sunshine or with fire.

After cleaning the air filter, re-install it into the unit. Reinstall and close the air-in grill in the reverse order depending on your specific air handler. Reconnect the control box cables to the corresponding terminators of the main body .




The air-in side should face down when using water.

Procedure	Problem
<p>If one of the following malfunctions occur, stop operation, shut off the power, and contact MRCOOL or your installation dealer.</p>	The operation lamp is flashing rapidly (5Hz). This lamp is still flashing rapidly after turning off the power for 3 minutes and turning it on again.
	A safety device such as a fuse or a breaker frequently actuates.
	Obstacles and water enter the unit.
	Water leaks from indoor unit.
	Other malfunctions not covered in the following troubleshooting tables.



CAUTION

Incorrect installation or incorrect voltage could cause above mentioned malfunctions.

Unit does not start	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Power failure. Power switch is off. Fuse of power switch may have burned. The fan speed can not be changed.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Check whether the MODE indicated on the display is "AUTO" 	When the automatic mode is selected, the air conditioner will automatically change the fan speed.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Check whether the MODE indicated on the display is "DRY" 	When dry operation is selected, the air conditioner will automatically change the fan speed. The fan speed can be selected during "COOL" , "FAN ONLY", and "HEAT"
The wire controller signal is not transmitted even when the ON/OFF button is pushed.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Check whether the signal transmitter of the wire controller is properly directed to the infrared signal receiver of the indoor unit. 	The power supply is off.
The TEMP. indicator does not come on.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Check whether the MODE indicated on the display is FAN ONLY 	The temperature cannot be set during FAN mode.
The indication on the display disappears after a lapse of time.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Check whether the timer operation has come to an end when the TIMER OFF is indicated on the display. 	The air conditioner operation will stop up to the set time

Troubleshooting

(2) The following situations are not operation failures.

Problem	Time of Occurrence	Cause
Unit doesn't run.	When unit is started immediately after it is just turned off.	Overload protection switch causes a 3 minute delay.
	When power is turned on.	Start up could be delayed up to 1 minute.
Mist comes from the unit.	During operation.	If the unit is running under high humidity, the wet air in the room will be quickly cooled down.
The unit generates noise.	Slight cracking sound is heard when unit is turned on.	Electronic expansion valve initialization can cause this noise temporarily.
	There is a continuous sound when cooling.	Gas refrigerant flow can cause a slight noise.
	The unit makes a sound when unit starts or stops.	Gas refrigerant flow can cause a slight noise.
	There is slight and continuous sound when unit is running or after running.	The drainage system can cause this noise during operation.
Dust comes from the unit.	When unit runs after no operation for a long period of time.	Dust has settled inside the indoor unit.
The unit emits odor.	During operation.	Smells from the operating environment may be pulled through the air handler.
The outdoor unit fan does not spin.	During operation.	The speed of the fan is controlled in order to optimize product operation.
The unit automatically changes to fan mode.	During cooling mode or heating mode.	This prevents indoor evaporator frosting or overheating and will start back up when the temperature changes.


